VERSES TO LIVE BY

'Enter through the narrow gate. For wide is the gate and broad is the road that leads to destruction, and many enter through it. But small is the gate and narrow the road that leads to Life, and only a few find it.' (Matthew 7:13-14)

From the start of my Christian journey this verse has always intrigued me. Jesus is describing the road to Life as being a narrow one when I would have thought that God would make it broad and wide. But no. The path through the wide gate becomes progressively narrower as we find that money and prestige and fame in fact steal the joy we were created for. But the gate to Life, as described by Jesus, is the narrow one, harder and difficult, but which opens up wide as we become free to enjoy God's creation and His promise of eternal life.

PALM SUNDAY is a Christian moveable feast that falls on the Sunday before Easter to celebrate the triumphal entry of Jesus Christ into Jerusalem - an event mentioned in all four canonical Gospels. The crowds greeted Him by waving palm branches and

covering His path with them. Immediately following this celebration, He begins His journey to the cross.

RICHMOND'S HIDDEN CHURCH (2)

At The Laying of the Foundation Stone ceremony at Holy Trinity Church, a glass tablet was embedded with the stone, inscribed with the words: 'The first stone of this church, to be consecrated to the service of The Holy Trinity, three Persons in One God, was laid by Her Royal Highness the Princess Mary Adelaide of Teck, on the 28th day of August, in the Year of Our Lord 1869.' However, we don't know the actual location. In 1938, the then Vicar, Basil Eldridge, did some research without success and concluded that they had probably been covered up by later building in the porch. I wonder if we'll ever know? On that day the Service ended with the hymn 'Christ is our Corner Stone' so our Newsletter is aptly named!

THE LAST WORD FROM TREVOR

A US writer Lee Strobel has written a book called *The* Case for Easter. Lee used to be sceptical about Christian faith. He is a former journalist who worked for the *Chicago Tribune*. He didn't believe in God and was convinced that Christianity was for the faint-hearted. Then something happened, Lee's wife became a Christian, and became more loving and joyful and fun than before.

So, Lee started to attend church and investigate Christianity, particularly the Resurrection of Jesus. One of the biggest problems that Lee faced was this: If Jesus really did spend three years with His disciples, and when He was crucified they all ran away, how were they later changed into martyrs if He stayed dead? Lee became convinced that Jesus was the Son of God and had risen; he became a follower of Jesus.

You may doubt the Easter message like Lee or Thomas, one of the disciples, but let me encourage you to explore faith - the Bible says when you seek God you will find Him.

EASTER IS NOT A BANK HOLIDAY



Easter helps us remember God's gift of life! We celebrate Easter in springtime when new life bursts out everywhere - daffodils come dancing out of dark earth and we know winter does not win. Death doesn't have the last word. Jesus didn't stay in the grave, so we can trust His promise of new life.

The Bible says that God loved us so much that He gave His only Son 'so that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life. Whoever believes in him is not condemned.' (John 3:16)

But why would any of us deserve condemnation? Surely we're good enough if we don't steal or murder? But imagine this scenario: you hire a huge cinema, invite everyone you've ever known plus your grandparents, parents, spouse, children ... then have your entire life played out on the screen. Include every single thought and deed - for instance, remember that night in October was it? In 1992 ...? All of us have memories that condemn us guilty.

The good news is that God is not out to condemn us - 'God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world.' (John 3:17)

Imagine that screen again - now God has sent Jesus to stand in front of it, His arms outstretched, putting all your sins behind Him, inviting you to trust His offer of forgiveness. Because Jesus died in your place, every sin can be written off, never to be referred to again. Now He offers you life in all its fullness. Wow!

Can you take some time this Easter to consider what it's all about?

A LIFE MORE REVOLUTIONARY*

In this sadly topical subject of the persecution of Christians throughout the world, one might ask 'twas ever thus? Jesus Himself warns 'If the world hates vou, know that it has hated me before it hated you' and 'Indeed, all who desire to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted.' However, as is Jesus' way, He also says 'Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you.'

It was because of a young Dutchman, Brother Andrew, who smuggled Bibles across the Iron Curtain to the persecuted church, that Open Doors was born. Some sixty years later, in February, we welcomed Eddie Lyle, (CEO of Open Doors UK and Ireland) who spelled out the reality. Did you know that Christians are the most persecuted people on earth?

Open Doors, now an international ministry, serves millions of persecuted Christians in over 50 countries - dangerous work in dangerous places. By supplying Bibles, leadership training, literacy programmes, livelihood support and advocacy services, Open Doors also works to mobilise the church in the UK & Ireland, not only to serve Christians living under religious persecution but also to learn from them what it means to be a disciple of Jesus.

Last month, Archbishop Justin Welby gave a keynote address at the launch of The Religious Liberty Commission at Westminster calling on the British government to intervene to prevent religious cleansing saying 'we must speak out in solidarity. Silence is not an option.'

And people are speaking out -5,534 people invited their MPs to the launch of Open Doors report 'Freedom of Religion and the Persecution of Christians'. An unprecedented 74 MPs came to the meeting. Your voice and prayers matter.

In the pipeline are monthly music/comedy/creative nights and they also meet for worship and brunch on a Sunday once a month at someone's home. Mainly people in their 20s and 30s, some returning to faith and lots bringing their boy and girlfriends who are not Christians. Everyone is very social and deep friendships have been formed.

Ed and Emma also have a new team of Club Angels starting at Tiger Tiger in Piccadilly, showing God's love to people when they are not feeling their 'best selves'. It's a brilliant ministry in which they partner with Third Space Ministries.

Emma says 'I would say the most exciting thing for us is to see, through community, discussion, sharing openly and journeying together, that people's lives. decisions and futures are changing. We hope to help people find a connection to Jesus for themselves that is meaningful and life changing and fun. We do have a lot of fun!'
